SOCIAL STUDIES TIME MACHINE STUDENT TIMELINE OF EXPECTATIONS

As a 6th grade, we will be presenting what we have learned about Ancient Civilizations and world history in an end-of-the-year Social Studies Time Machine where you will be "transported back in time" to your assigned period and civilization. Students will showcase their understanding of historical figures by bringing research articles that help them to answer a set of questions that will be answered in a play-like format with other students in the class. Students will then present their information to the school as if they were on a talk show with historical figures from other civilizations.

<u>Research</u>

3-5 articles specifically about your historical figure and their achievements, accomplishments, life, etc. They must be printed off and brought to class on the assigned due date. Please keep your articles neatly stapled or paper clipped together.

<u>Costume</u>

Please be prepared to wear a costume that imitates what your historical figure may have worn during that time period. Costumes may be created by hand, or purchased from the store. Please remember that the costume needs to follow the Snow Springs dress code standards.

Backdrop/Set

You will be working in a small group of 5-6 other individuals to create a set that represents a talk show. You may use paper, fabric and PVC, cardboard, wood or any other material that is freestanding and can fit through a standard door. Aside from the backdrop, you are also asked to decorate your own school desk with butcher paper so that it looks like a talk show podium. **The podium must include your historical figure's name, civilization, and birth/death dates (If applicable) that can be read up to 25 feet away.**
